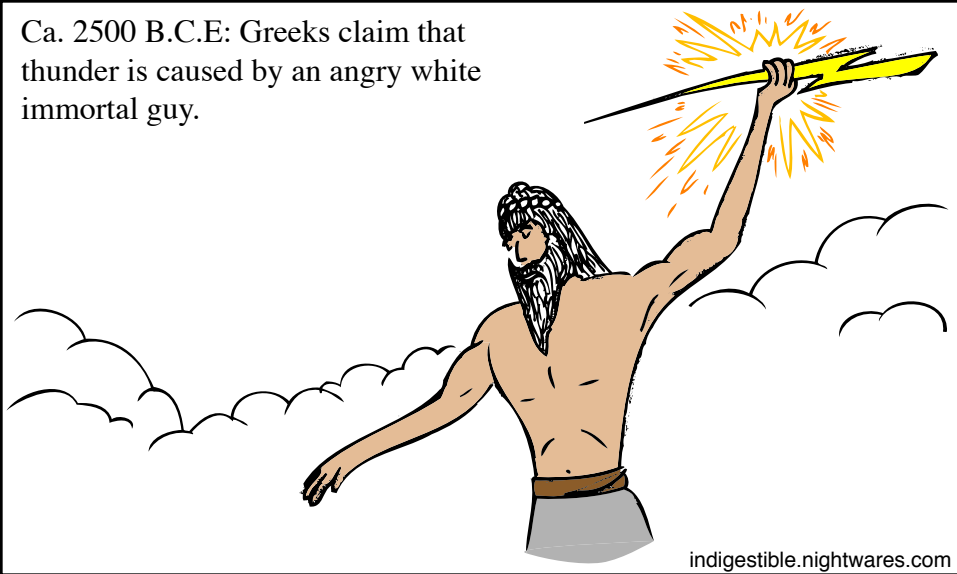


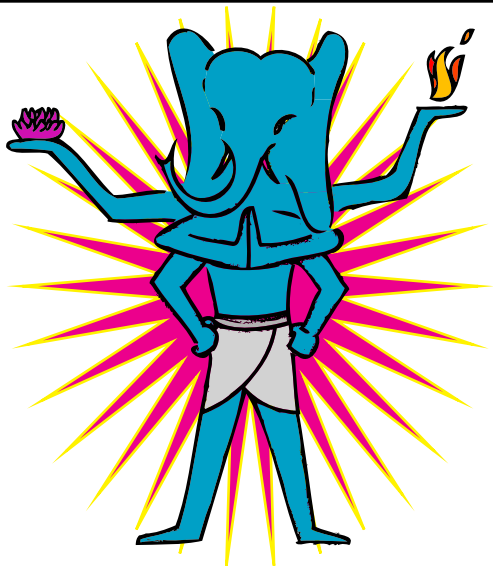

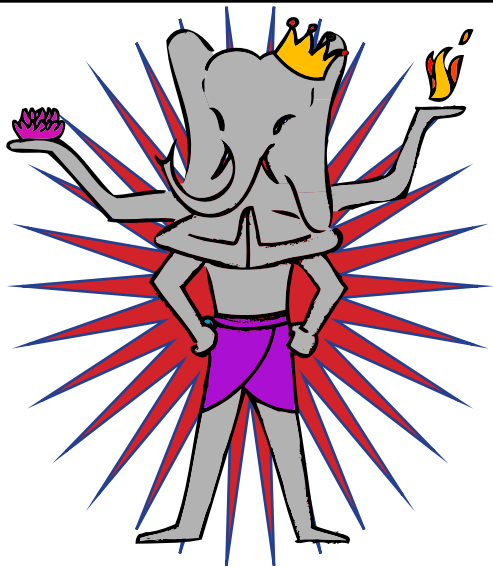
Ca. 2500 B.C.E: Greeks claim that thunder is caused by an angry white immortal guy.



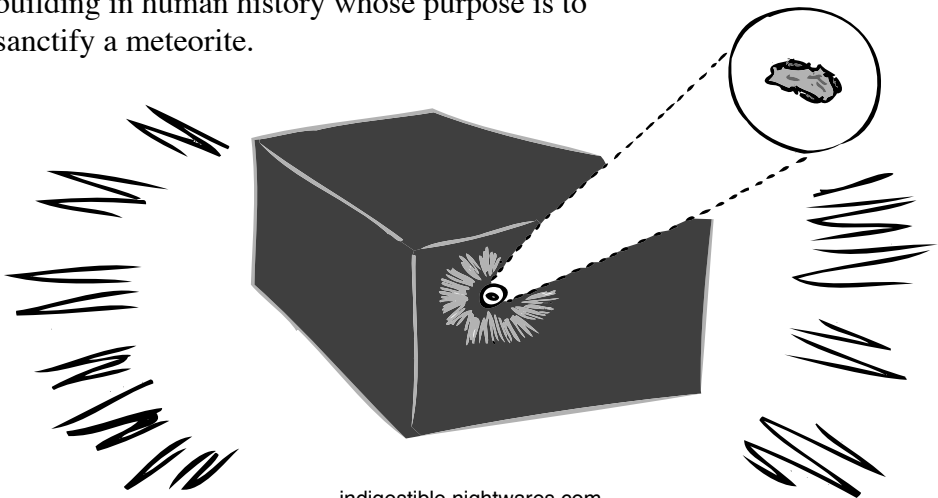
Ca. 5000 B.C.E: Hindu pantheon includes multiple-armed entities with elephant, human and other heads, all with blue skin.



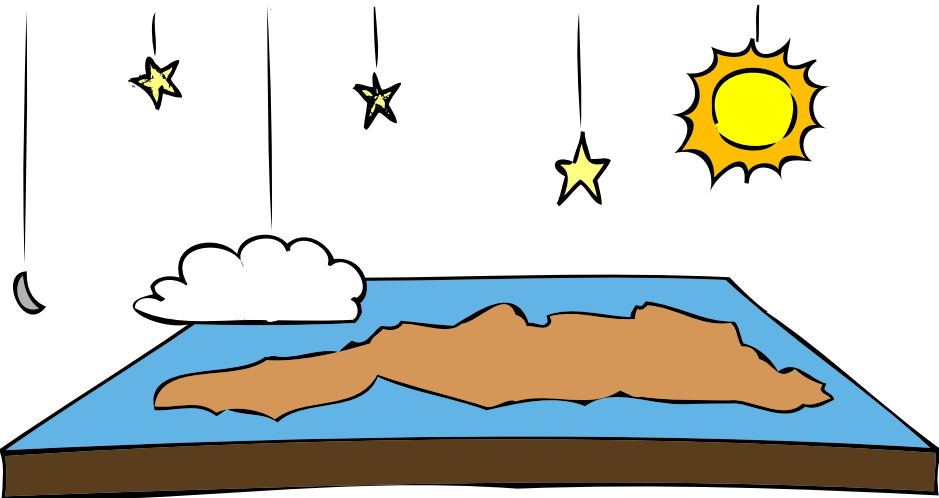
1931: Jean de Brunhoff

Babar.



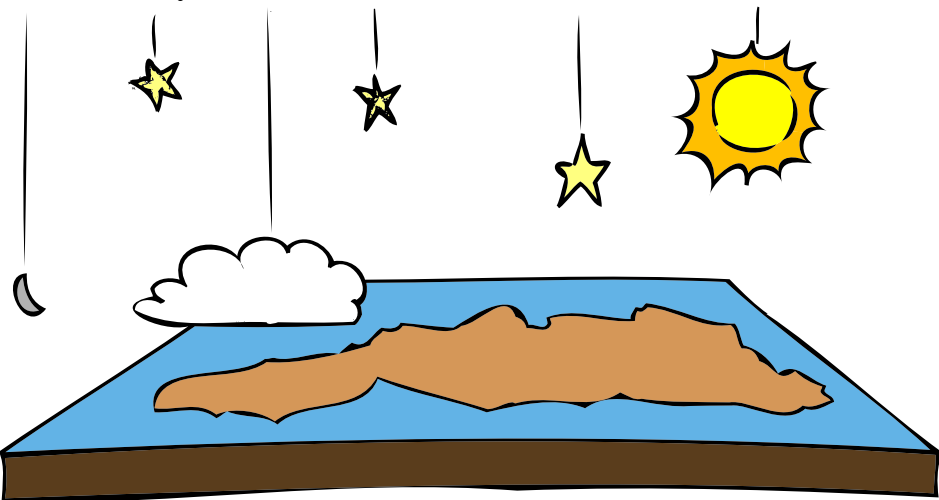
630: Muslims erect the Qabba, the only permanent building in human history whose purpose is to sanctify a meteorite.



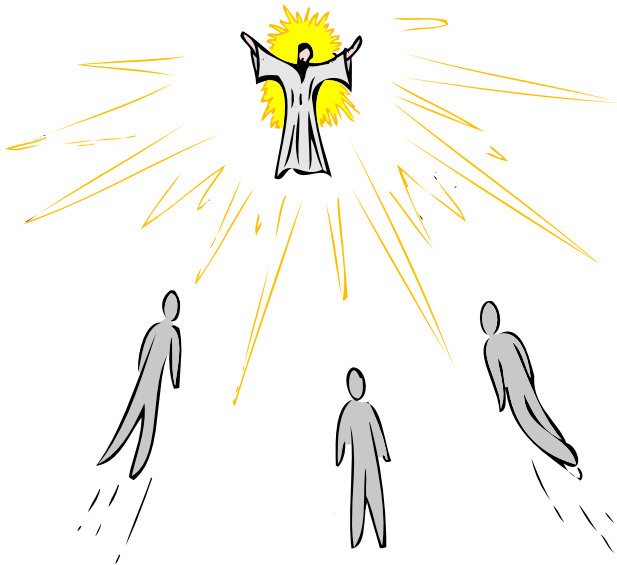
Ca. 5000 B.C.E: Jewish tribes believe in a flat Earth.
